Nuts & Bolts

- Preside over Meetings
 - Regular Club meetings
 - Executive Committee (EC) meetings
- Earn Distinguished Club (DCP) recognition
 - First step: Develop the DCP with EC & Club
 - Second step: Assuring productive meetings that follow the education program
- Recognize member achievement
- Lead and guide
 - Set the tone! From the DCP and initial meetings, set the vision of the club for the upcoming year
- District and International responsibilities

Practical Nuts & Bolts

- Make sure officer updates are entered in the TM website in June
- Assure that a budget is prepared
- Clearly establish roles (and backups) for various club operations:
 - Meeting guests
 - Responding to club leads
 - Following up with guests and leads
 - Who is setting up?
 - Who is the Zoom master?
- Assure club events (elections, contest, Open houses) are planned
- Have at least one person mentor you in your role as President

Leading in a volunteer organization

- What are the challenges to leading a team of volunteers?
- Challenges
 - You didn't hire them!
 - You cannot fire them!
 - If you push too hard, will you lose a member?

How to maintain officer involvement

- Stick to the club mission!
- Show that you value their time:
 - Stay on your agenda
 - Get input and feedback from all members of the EC
 - If something is not getting done, find the explanation and determine a way to get the objective completed
 - Provide positive reinforcement
